Stan's "Dog With a Blog" Sticker BINGO

Who better than the smartest dog around to inspire a game based on letters, numbers and spelling? This homemade BINGO game uses numbered ping pong balls and printable cards. All you need is a caller and two to six players to fill up a card before one lucky winner yells, "BINGO!"

You'll Need

- 30 ping pong balls, available online or at sporting goods stores
- Permanent marker or optional pre-made letter and number stickers (available at crafts stores or online)
- A plastic bowl or jar large enough to hold 30 ping pong halls
- Provided BINGO cards on the following pages
- White card stock, 6 sheets
- Heavy paper, 6 assorted colors
- 1-inch circle lever punch

How to Make It

- To make the BINGO balls, use a permanent marker to write the letter/number combinations on the ping pong balls or attach pre-made letter and number stickers. For "B," use 1 through 6; for "I," 7 through 12; for "N," 13 through 18; for "G," 19 through 24; and for "O," 25 through 30.
- 2. Place the ping pong balls in the glass bowl or jar and set aside for now.
- 3. Print the downloadable BINGO cards onto the sheets of card stock to make six different playing cards. To prevent cards from easily falling apart, you can choose to laminate them at a copy store.

4. Have a grown-up use a circle punch to make BINGO chips out of heavy paper, distributing 25 chips of the same color to each of the players. Alternately, you can use other items easily found around the home as card markers (for example, uncooked beans, buttons, pennies, etc.)
