



Liv and Maddie's Halloween Screamefest Party Ideas

Hop along for a "Kanga-Rooney" good time this Halloween with some ghoulishly good party ideas from Liv, Maddie and all the Rooneys. Whether at school or at home, you can make your own invitations, decorations, crafts, games, food and favors – all themed around Liv and Maddie's spook-tacular new Halloween episode.

INVITATIONS

Liv and Maddie's Sparkly Jack-o'-Basketballs make for a cute invitation idea. Use a compass to trace circles on "twin" pieces of orange construction paper and one sheet of plain white paper. Cut out each of the three circles. Use a black marker to draw basketball lines on one of the orange circles and a pretty pumpkin face on the other. Write the details of your get-together on the white circle and sandwich it in between the orange ones. Use a hole punch through all three, then secure the sheets together with green curly ribbons to make a pumpkin stem. Send them off in black or vellum envelopes stuffed with a handful of Liv's signature gold glitter.

PRINTABLE DECORATIONS



Greet guests with these festive printable decorations! Use a color printer to print and cut out Liv's kangaroo costume, Maddie's knight costume, and Joey's "Ask Me About My Zombie Disguise" black t-shirt.

Decorate surfaces with these, hang them from the ceiling or overhang at varying heights with curly ribbons or bouncy coils purchased from craft and party stores.





BOO-TIFUL DECORATIONS

Create a "Halloween Screamefest Banner" like the one at Ridgewood High that doubles as both a table runner and a party craftivity. Lay out butcher paper the length of the table before guests arrive. Place black and orange markers, Halloween-themed stencils, foam rubber paintbrushes and assorted stickers around the table and let the guests do their own scarifying.

Hand-painted "Caution: Haunted Crime Scene" tape is also easy to make using plain orange crepe paper and colored markers.

For the centerpiece, make your own "Pepino the Clown" with a carve-able foam pumpkin and stuffed clown, both available at craft stores. You can even turn it into a jack-in-the-box using a hand-cranked musical pop-up kit, available online.

GAMES & ACTIVITIES

● Diggie and Maddie's Homonym Word Game

Diggie and Maddie got confused between the words "night" and "knight," ruining their chances for the Couples Costume contest. Play Diggie and Maddie's Homonym Word Game as you would a round of charades. Write the following homonyms on slips of paper, dividing them equally between two teams. Use a kitchen timer as players take turns acting out one or both of the following homonyms:

● Glow-in-the-Dark Pumpkin Bowling

A long hallway makes a great Halloween bowling alley – using a pumpkin ball and butternut squash pins -- like the one Diggie and Maddie used at the Ridgewood High Screamefest. You can even paint your gourd-geous gourds with glow-in-the-dark paint, then dim the lights for a howling good time.

Crank up the karaoke machine with plenty of Halloween and pop favorites to throw your own version of Liv's "Sing It Loud" Karaoke Competition.

SNACKS & TREATS

- Liv's Kanga-Rooney Shrimps on the Barbie

In keeping with the Australian theme of Liv's kangaroo costume, have a grown-up grill up some Kanga-Rooney Shrimps on the Barbie (shrimps on skewers).

- Maddie and Diggie's Burger Balls

Give ordinary turkey burger patties a twist by having kids cut them up into basketball and football shapes using a butter knife.

- Joey's Peanut Butter Banana Snacks

This healthy bite-sized snack makes for a tasty nod to The King. Have kids cut bananas into rounds using a butter knife and spread a smidge of peanut butter on top.

- Which Witch Punch

To wash it all down, brew up a cauldron of Which Witch Punch using green sports drink and scoops of green sherbet.

PARTY FAVORS

- Maddie's Jack-o'-Basketballs

Add a packet of orange-flavored gelatin to your favorite crisped rice marshmallow treat recipe. When it cools, shape them into balls. Using a black edible pen, draw lines on each orange ball to resemble a basketball. Fill glassine bags with the crisped rice marshmallow balls and tie each one closed with a ribbon.

- Liv's "Sing It Loud" Swag Bags

Stuff gold and silver craft bags filled with wrapped candy, lip gloss, toys, seasonal treats, and other fabulous goodies that Liv would love.
