The Love Bug, made in 1968, is the first in a series of comedy films made by Walt Disney Productions that starred an anthropomorphic pearl-white, ragtop 1963 Volkswagen racing Beetle named Herbie. It was based on the 1961 book *Car, Boy, Girl* by Gordon Buford.

The movie follows the adventures of Herbie, Herbie's driver Jim Douglas (Dean Jones), and Jim's love interest, Carole Bennett (Michele Lee). It also features Buddy Hackett as Jim's enlightened, kind-hearted friend, Tennessee Steinmetz, a character who creates "art" from used car parts.
