## **DIRECTIONS**

In this activity, you are going to play the role of presidential advisor. You will research a foreign policy issue and develop recommendations for United States action. Lessons from the Cold War should inform the development of the recommendations.

1. Developing a solution to a problem requires a definition of what is known and believed about the the problem. Based upon what you know about the foreign policy issue you are studying, write a

statement identifying what you know and believe about the problem. Be sure to identify the key people and what you know about them.
