There are countless ways you can play around with the elements you'll find in this Scrapbooking Kit.

Challenge yourself by using different paper stock and textures, and the design elements contained in the kit.

Materials:

Ink Jet Printer
Sticker Paper for Ink Jet Printers (if using stickers)
Card Stock or Cover Stock (optional)
Regular Printer Paper (optional)
Scissors
Archival Tape for Photos
Two-Sided Tape

Step 1: Printing

Choose from the following sets: **Alphabet, Borders, Design Elements and Patterns**. Decide what type of paper you would like to use for the different sets and print.

Follow manufacturer's instructions when loading your choice of paper. Handle paper by the edges to avoid fingerprints. (For best results, load only one sheet at a time.)

Tips & Tricks:

- To select the proper print settings in Adobe Acrobat click Print; in the print dialogue box select properties; choose the appropriate paper type; and then select the highest print quality.
- We recommend that you run a test print on regular paper to double-check the layout and design. (If problems occur, check your printer manual for additional printing instructions.)

Step 2: Dry

Let paper dry several minutes before handling.

Step 3: Cut

Cut out all your elements and decorate your scrapbook page using the **Happy Times** layout as a guide – or create a totally different layout of your own.









Here are a few sample layouts to give you design inspiration when creating your scrapbook pages. You may choose to design your pages exactly as the layouts show or play around with all the elements in the Scrapbooking Kit, mixing and matching the designs.


However you choose to use these elements, you're sure to create innovative pages by adding your own individual style and flair to your work. The possibilities are endless... and so is the fun!

Tips:

- 1. We used a scrapbook page that measured 12" x 12" but all the designs can be used on smaller or larger pages.
- 2. We designed our Scrapbooking Kit with colors that coordinate between all three kits. For example, if you want to use a design element from the "Friends" kit with a design element from the "Happy Times" kit, they will mix and match.
- **3.** Playing around with different textures will add dimension to your pages. Printing some of the elements on card or cover stock, or using sticker paper for other elements, will give your pages a richness that will make them pop.
- **4.** Little details go a long way in creating great pages. Try adding ribbons, eyelets, vellum, and other embellishments to make your pages even more unique. Challenge yourself and let the designer in you go wild!









Why spend money on a store-bought card when you can craft a custom greeting for friends and family?

Materials:

Ink Jet Printer
Sticker Paper for Ink Jet Printers (if using stickers)
Card Stock or Cover Stock Paper
Regular Printer Paper
Scissors
Tape

Step 1: Print a Pattern

Load card or cover stock paper into printer following manufacturer's instructions. (Handle paper by the edges to avoid fingerprints.) Select one of the **Pattern** pieces and print.

Tips & Tricks:

- To select the proper print settings in Adobe Acrobat click Print; in the print dialogue box select properties; choose the appropriate paper type; and then select the highest print quality.
- We recommend that you run a test print on regular paper to double-check the layout and design. (If problems occur, check your printer manual for additional printing instructions.)

Step 2: Print Card Template

Print the Greeting Card Template on regular printer paper. (For best results, load only one sheet at a time.)

Step 3: Dry

Let paper dry several minutes before handling.

Step 4: Cut Out Card Template


Following the solid black lines, cut out the card.


Step 5: Tape & Cut

Position the card template over the pattern piece and cut around the template (tape template down if necessary to prevent it from moving.)


Step 6: Decorate
